# Ione girls defeated by Heppner Fillies

The Ione girls' basketball team fell to 2-5 on Saturday, Dec. 17 as they were beaten by the Heppner Fillies 74 to 16. Heppner ran out to a 24-3 lead after the first quarter. Jodi Padberg had eight for the Fillies and Deena Hams three for the Cardinals.

The Fillies took a 50 to six halftime advantage by out-scoring Ione 26-3 in the second stanza.

All of Ione's third period points were scored from the free throw line as Heppner's lead increased to 58-10.

Heppner went on to win 74-16 by scoring 16 points in the fourth quarter to six for Ione. Ione made five of 26 field goals for 19 percent while Heppner made 31 of 67 shots, 46 percent. Ione was 6 of 24 from the foul line, 25 percent. Heppner made 12 of 25 foul shots for 48 percent.

Hams and Sandi Wright led Ione in scoring with six each. Missy Eubanks made 13 for Heppner followed by Padberg with 10.

# Cardinals lose to Mustangs

The Ione boys' basketball team lost to the Heppner Mustangs 55 to 41 on Saturday, Dec. 17. Ione fell to 2-5 in the season.

Heppner jumped out to a 15 to 10 lead at the end of the first quarter. Craig Hams and Randy McCabe both scored four points for Ione as John Martin scored six for Heppner.

The Mustangs led the Cardinals 29 to 21 at halftime by outscoring Ione 14-11 in the second period.

In the third quarter Ione was outscored 12 to 8 as Heppner's lead increased to 41-29.

Mark Meyers scored eight points in the fourth stanza but

Heppner won 55-41. Greg Orr had seven in the stanza for the Mustangs.
