Neither team scored many points in the third period as the Pirates lead was 41-14.

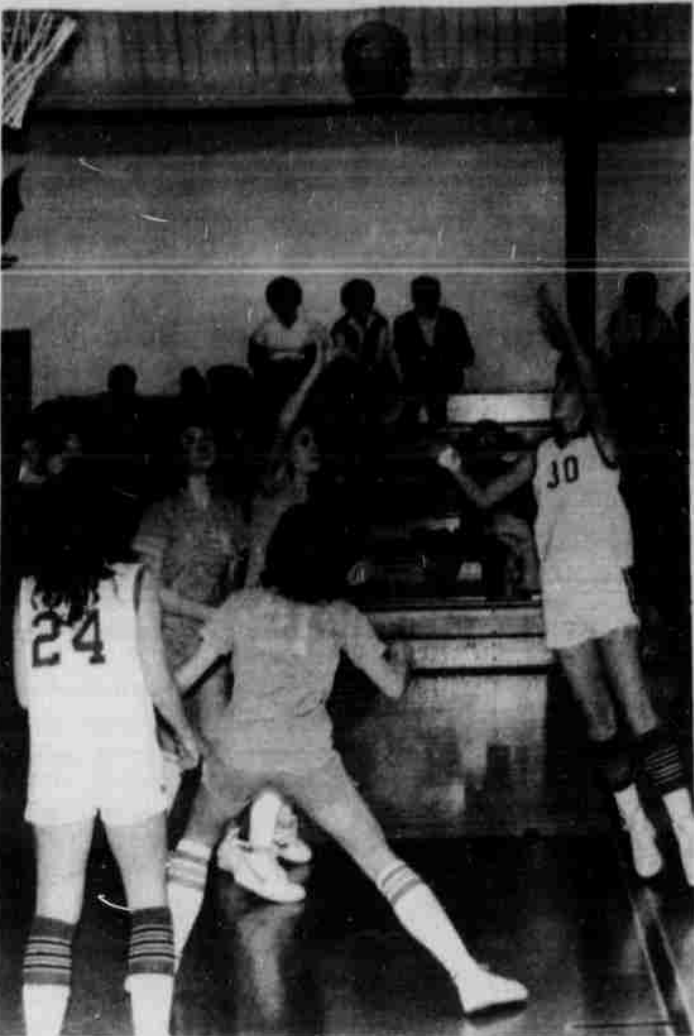
The Cardinals were out-scored six to five in the fourth quarter. Cascade Locks won 47 to 19.
