## 4-H poster program details available

Morrow County 4-H members with an interest in art and a desire to tell others about 4-H should be interested in the 1984 national 4-H poster program, according to Birdine Tullis, extension program assistant.

Details about the 1984 program, sponsored by the National 4-H Council in cooperation with Coats and Clark, have just been received in the county Extension office, Tullis said.

Entries, which are due in the county office May 11, may reflect one of two suggested

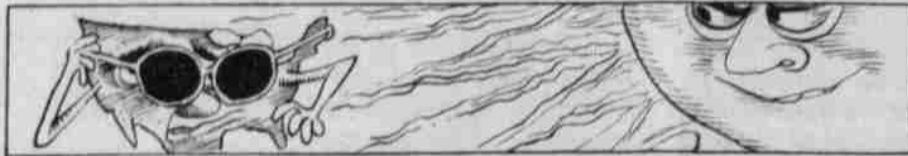
themes: "4-H - Learning for Life" and "4-H - Picture the Possibilities." A third category, called the "open theme," allows 4-H'ers to create a poster illustrating their own ideas.

Each 4-H member may enter one 14 by 22 inch poster. The poster must not be three-dimensional, but may be created in any medium, such as watercolor, ink, crayon, oil or collage.

Top entries from Morrow County will be displayed in the state 4-H poster contest during the 1984-4-H Summer Week

program at Oregon State University June 11-16. At that time, three entries from the Oregon program will be selected for display during the National 4-H Congress in Chicago next fall.

The 4-H poster program is seen as an opportunity for 4-H members to express their ideas about what 4-H is to them. In addition, entries in the national program are used to suggest ideas for national themes for the youth educational program, Tullis explained.
