The Fillies continued to play tough defense the rest of the quarter but the Fillies couldn't quite pull through and the game went to the Sherman County Huskies. The final score was 24-45.

"I feel that we out-played Sherman in almost every area. Our ball handling was better and we stole the ball much more than they did. We were rebounding pretty well considering the height factor against us. We moved the ball well in the first and third quarters, but had very poor second and fourth quarters. This is the first game that they've played where they got so discouraged they gave up in the fourth quarter. Usually our fourth quarter is our strongest."

"The main cause for our discouragement was our inability to hit the bucket. We shot 47 times and only connected with nine. Some contributing factors to this problem were: 1. No practice Friday. 2. Three games in one week. 3. Out late the night before watching the varsity game. Those three factors won't occur again this season so I'm looking forward to better games in the future," said Coach Karen Howe.

Missy Euhanks led the Fillies with 16 points. Christy Rathbun led the team with rebounds while Missy Euhanks led with steals. The team totals were 34 rebounds and 28 steals.

Heppner's JV team will play Weston-McEwen at home on Friday at 3 p.m. On Tuesday, Feb. 14 the JV Fillies will travel to Condon for a 6 p.m. match.

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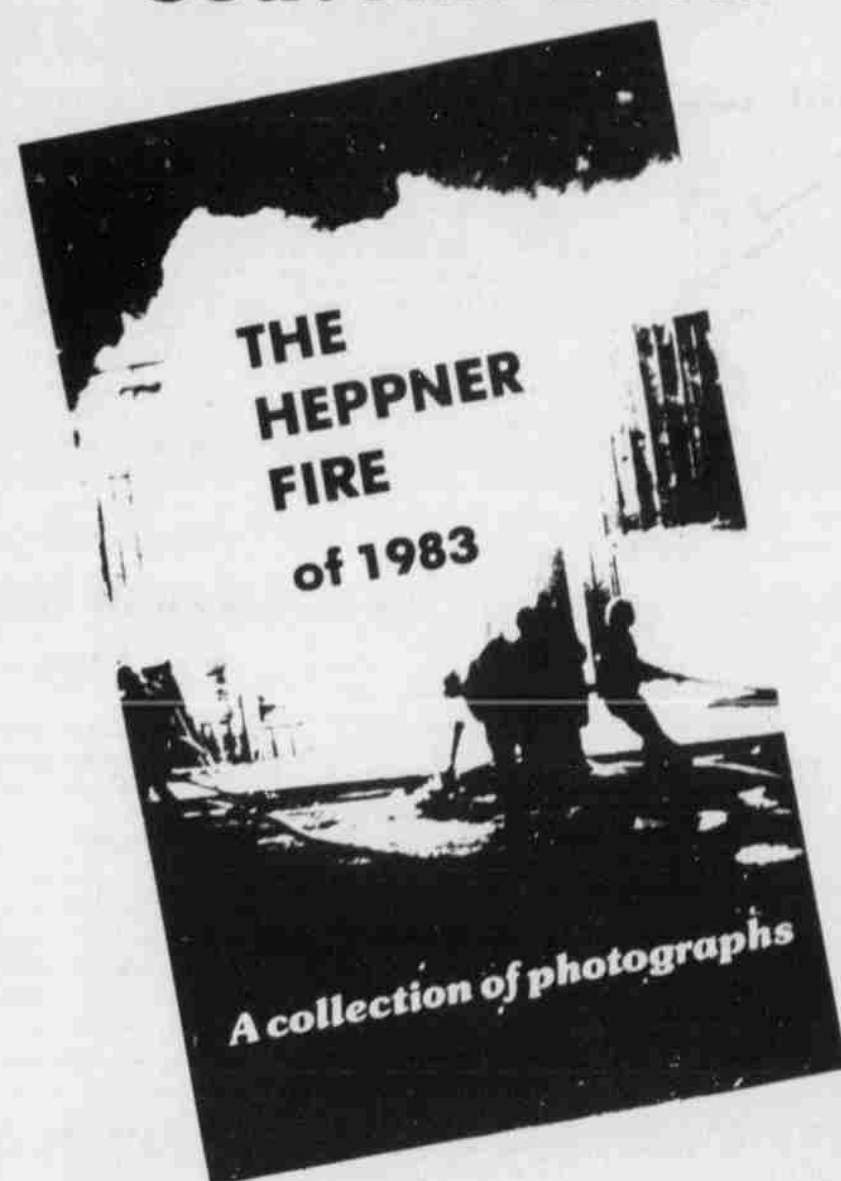
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
