To the editor:
 The following letter was received by David Barnett, Ione, from Congressman Bob Smith, concerning W.P.P.S.S.:
 Dear David:
 Thank you for taking time to respond to my recent town meeting notice. I appreciate hearing from constituents on matters of importance to them.
 No legislation has been considered by the House of Representatives to spread the cost of W.P.P.S.S. to all the ratepayers in the Northwest. Because the electrical rates which those of us in the West

are substantially lower than the rates paid by the rest of the nation, few members of Congress are interested in the W.P.P.S.S. problem.
 It is possible that some legislation will be considered by Congress to resolve the W.P.P.S.S. problem. If that occurs, I will keep your thoughts in mind.
 Thanks, again, for writing. If I can be of assistance to you in the future, I am as close as my toll-free telephone number.

Reye's syndrome (pronounced "rye") is recognized by the U.S. Public Health Service as one of the top ten killers among children's diseases.
 The U.S. Surgeon General has issued a warning to parents: "Don't immediately give aspirin or any medication containing aspirin to children with chicken pox or flu." Check first with your doctor. The relationship between Reye's and aspirin is suspected, not proven.

 Reye's syndrome most often strikes children between five and 16 who are recovering from viral infections, such as flu or chicken pox.
