The Heppner Varsity Fillies met the Sherman County Huskies Saturday, Feb. 4.

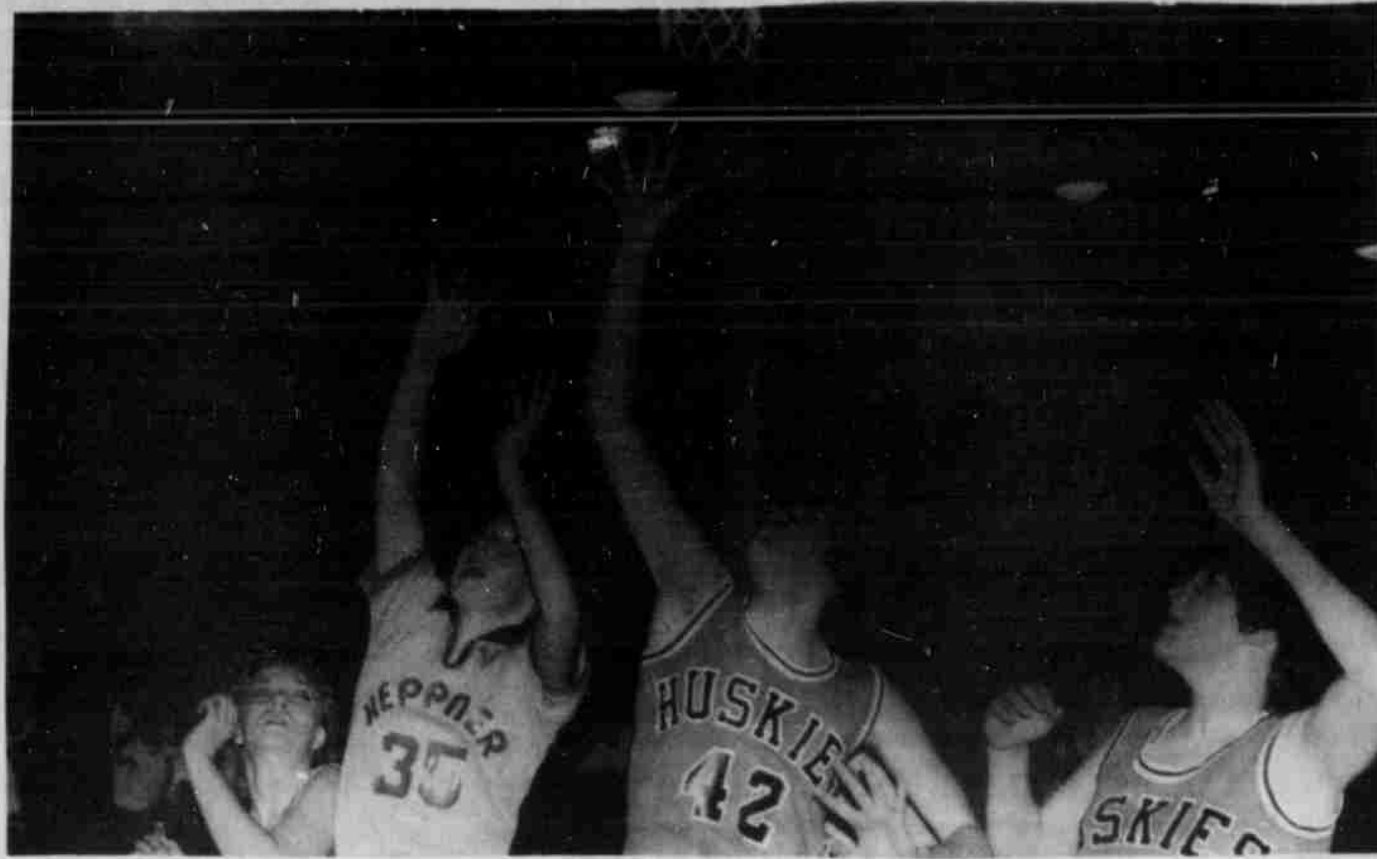
