

Cards unsuccessful in match with Helix Grizzlies

The lone boys' basketball team lost to the Helix Grizzlies on Friday, Feb. 10. The final score was 63 to 43.

Helix took an opening stanza lead of 10-8. Jeff Lembeck scored seven for Helix while Randy McCabe had six.

Lembeck and Bruce Sprating scored all 17 of the Grizzlies second quarter points as Helix led 27 to 18 at the half.

Helix upped its lead to 44-29 after three periods by scoring 17 to the Cardinals 11.

The Grizzlies won the game by a final tally of 63 to 43.

McCabe led lone with 24 points, 16 of them in the second half. Lone grabbed 31 rebounds, with Craig Newton and Lembeck pulling down seven and six respectively.

From the foul line lone was 5 of 11 for 45 percent. Helix shot 55 percent making 11 of 20 shots. The Cards made 31 percent of their field goals shooting 19 of 61. The Grizzlies were 26 of 57 for 46 percent.
