The Heppner Mustangs finished their season in high fashion. Even though they lost 43-38, they played a heck of a game against the fourth ranked Pilot Rock Rockets Friday night at home.

"I thought we played very well," said Coach Brent Eggers. "We did everything right but shoot free throws."

Heppner would have won if they would have converted their free throws, connecting on only 10 of 21 Pilot Rock hit 17 of 24. Both teams also shot poorly from the field. Heppner was 14 for 46 from the field for 30 percent and Pilot Rock shot 34 percent.

The Mustangs were only down by one at the end of the first quarter but were out-scored nine to four in the second quarter. Heppner was down by six, 21-15, at the half.

Heppner did, however, make a strong comeback in the third quarter and the Mustangs heading into the fourth. In the fourth, the Mustangs tied up the game at 38, but a critical turnover broke the game open and Pilot Rock hit

their free throw to seal the victory.

Rod Cole led Heppner with 12 points and Greg Orr chipped in with 10 points and nine rebounds. Tim Weinke and Sean Britt had 11 points for the winners.
