Some of the two million Americans who must have daily injections to control their diabetes can feel more like winners than to some recent scientific achievements.



For years, scientists have sought to win a way to monitor sugar levels quickly, accurately and inexpensively. Blood sugar levels vary widely, depending on the amount of exercise a person takes, how much and what is eaten and how the insulin is administered and distributed in the body. The last few years have seen a revolution in the control of diabetes with the advent of chemically treated strips that measure blood sugar levels after being covered with a drop of blood and read in a machine.

Scientists have now simplified the process so the diabetic, working with his doctor, can now perform the test and read the information without a machine. The test is made simple with the Chemstrip bG, developed and produced by Bio-Dynamics, a Boehringer Mannheim company.
