His mother says that it is planned that Charlie will come from Phoenix to Bend, about the end of March. He will stay with friends there while he continues daily therapy.

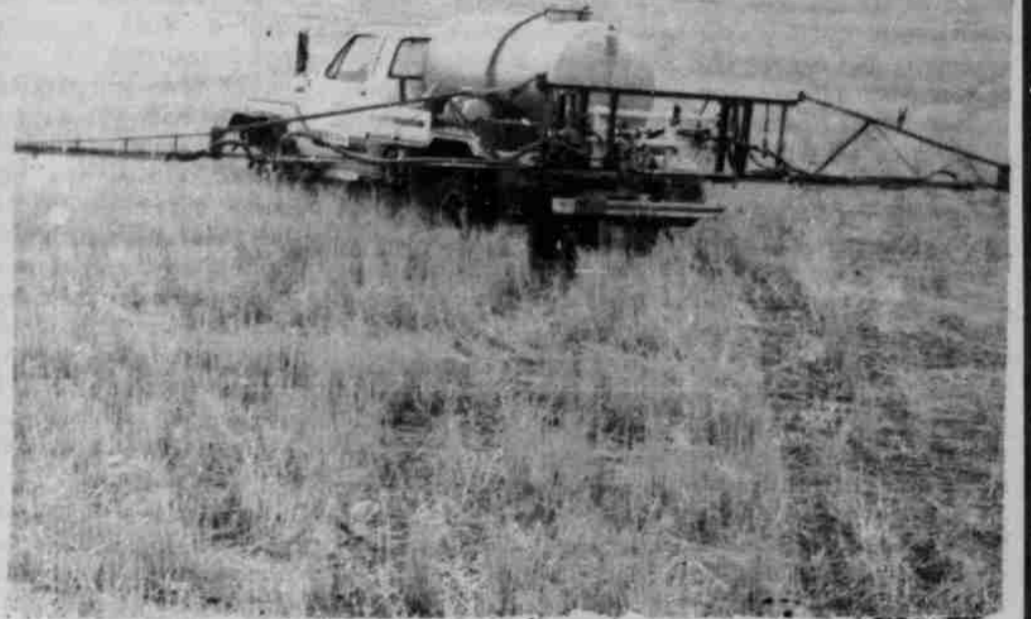
When Jane flew north from Phoenix, she was met at the Portland Airport by her daughter, Carol Brewster, and

HEPPNER - Reese A. Burkenbine, formerly of Heppner, died March 3, 1984, at a Veterans' Hospital in Fort Lewis, Wash.

He was born April 29, 1916 to Arthur E. and Mabel Hutchens Burkenbine in Stites, Idaho. In 1918, the family moved to Hermiston. They came to Heppner in 1928.

Mr. Burkenbine attended Heppner schools and graduated from Heppner High School.

In the 1930s, he moved to Walla Walla, Wash., where he worked as a meat cutter for Safeway. He then joined the U.S. Navy. After serving with the Navy, he returned to work for Safeway, and later joined the Army. He had a distinguished military career.

After retiring, he settled in the Spanaway, Wash. area.

Funeral services were held March 6 at Evergreen Memorial Gardens in Vancouver, Wash. with the Rev. James Watson officiating.

Survivors include his wife, Mary, of Spanaway; sons Reese Forrest Burkenbine of Heppner, Arthur Leroy Burkenbine of Umatilla and Robert Burkenbine of Germany; daughters Carol Crenshaw of Bremerton, Wash. and Sherry Hunter of Germany; brothers Albert Burkenbine of Wilkesboro, N.C., Merle Burkenbine of North Wilkesboro, N.C. and Loyd Burkenbine of Heppner.

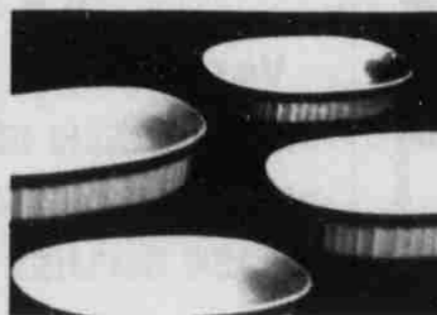

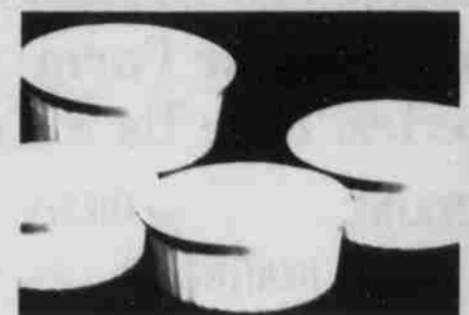
