This year "Lunchless Wednesday" has turned into "Beef Feeds the Huntry." The concept is the same - the money will be given to the Salvation Army in the form of beef gift certificates.

The Oregon State CowBelles would like to know our opinion on the issue - "Should the Oregon CowBelles change their name to the Oregon Cattlewomen, Inc? Some states have already made the change, Michigan and Illinois. The pros are: the new name would be more easily identifiable to urban consumers; the new name would possibly be more effective when signed at the end of letters to the editor and/or letters to congressmen or congresswomen; and the group has been and will continue to be involved in serious problems affecting the beef industry and a name that is more on the serious side would be appropriate.

If the Morrow County CowBelles have ideas and thoughts about this name change, members are asked to make their opinion known to the officers.

Did you know these facts about beef? Fact: Beef is highly nutritious and digestible - more so even than vegetables. Beef's healthful ingredients are 96 percent digested, and its many nutrients almost completely used by the body.

Fact: Three ounces of lean beef contain less fat than is assumed - about nine grams. And only about 48 percent of the fat is saturated. Fact: Red meat is a leading source of iron; one three-ounce serving of beef supplies 26 percent of the recommended daily allowance for an adult male. And this is "heme iron," a type that is three to five times more easily absorbed by the body. Heme iron also has a booster effect on iron in other foods eaten with the meat. (Much of the iron in
