## Co. Court considers telephone line

Morrow County Court convened on Wednesday, March 21 and conducted the following business:

—agreed to get specifications from Valcomp and AT&T on a telephone line which would eliminate the need for each county office to have its own number. This would save the county an estimated \$5,000 per year, according to Judge Don McElligott.

—learned that \$4,349 may be allocated to Morrow County from state recreational vehicle user fees for fiscal year 1983-84.

—appointed Barbara Bloodworth, county clerk, as Records Officer to be responsible for public records both historical and current.

—discussed a building inspection fee policy for concrete machinery bases. Currently the policy sees a machinery base built into a concrete foundation as different from machinery that is bolted down to the concrete and each is inspected accordingly. No action was taken.

—discussed an irrigation pipeline belonging to Arnold Braat in Boardman which travels beneath a county road that is currently being constructed.

## Child I.D. program set Apr. 11-12

The Heppner-Ione branch of the American Association of University Women, Heppner Lion's Club and the Heppner Soroptimist Club announce the rescheduling of the child identification and fingerprinting program to the night of April 11 and 12 from 5 to 7:30 p.m. The program will be conducted at the Heppner Grade School cafeteria room.

The sponsoring clubs ask that the children be brought in according to the following schedule: Children with last names ending in A-F from 5 to 6:30, April 11, children with last names from G-M from 6 to 7:30, April 11, children with last names from N-S 5 to 6:30 on April 12 and children with

names T-Z from 6 to 7:30 on April 12. The clubs request this schedule be followed as much as possible when bringing the children to be fingerprinted.

This program is conducted in conjunction with Eastern Oregon's Friends of Child Find. The purpose of the program is to provide the parents with a readily available packet of information which can be used in the event of the child's disappearance.
