Road work continues between Ione & Lexington



The old portion of the highway is to the right and above the dazer. The new roadbed is substantially lower and will require removal of more of the bank.

A week ago Monday, when Central Columbia Construction stripped the pavement from the road by a field near the Ken Palmer ranch, they uncovered a pond. They then had to excavate 1,600 cubic yards of mud and haul in rock to set up a road before traffic could use that portion of the road between Lexington and Ione. The road was blocked for most of a day said Dave Gilmore, a spokesperson for the construction company who continues that this should not hamper their finishing the subgrade road bed by the end of April when Morris Brothers will begin graveling and paving the road.

problem to deal with in the realignment of the road which began last November. Extreme cold caused them to shut down construction for a month, and the rain presents another problem.

Central Columbia Construction has subcontracted the excavation and pipe work from Morris Brothers, whom Gilmore identifies as the prime contractors for the eight miles of road construction, a \$1,795,000 project awarded by the Highway Division of the Oregon State Department of Transportation.
