The door prize, an orchid corsage, was won by Josie Peck.

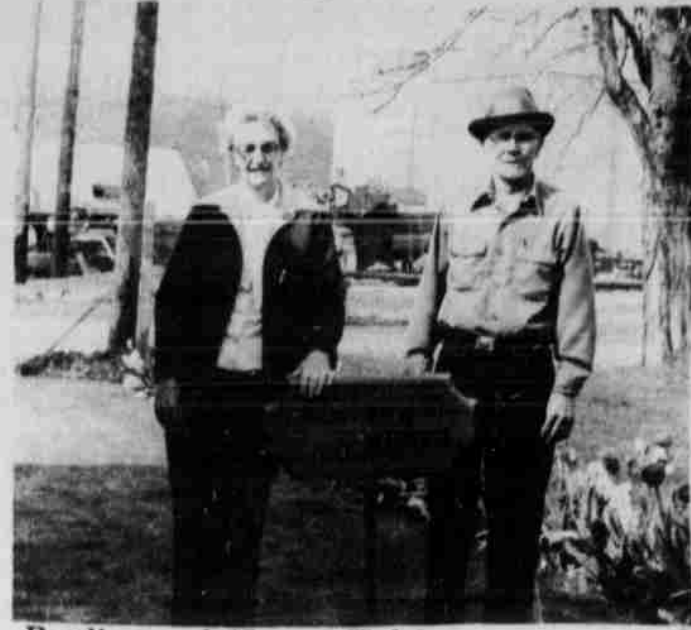
The supper Committee for the May meeting will be Mr. and Mrs. Norman Nelson and Mr. and Mrs. Chuck Nelson.

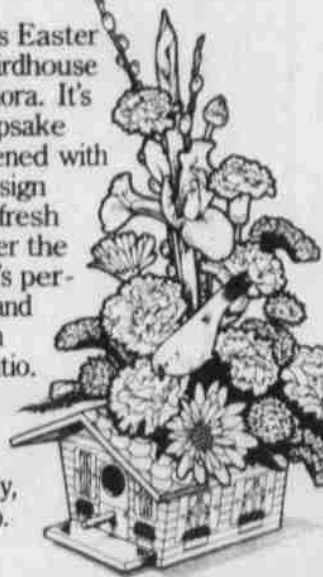
