Thomas also wrote the expose on wild horses a couple of years ago which resulted in personal threats and intimidation. She has also recently written a book about predator control. The book is well written and the Morrow County CowBelles suggest that you purchase one. The book is available for \$3.50 from the Record Stockman Press, 103 Livestock Exchange Building, Denver, Colorado 80216.

Baxter Black, D.V.M. a noted veterinarian, livestock health columnist and cowboy humorist did the foreword for Heather Thomas's book, "Red Meat." It was done with a lot of thought and humor too. Something to share with you:

"Man crawled his way up the evolutionary ladder plodding along at a dinosaur pace. Eventually he learned to use his hands. He became a hunter. In a single four ounce serving of baboon brain or mastodon liver he received more high quality nutrients than he could get in a week of digging roots, cracking nuts and eating cattails. Man underwent a development unheard of in Darwins chronicles; his brain more than doubled in size in a short million years."

Here we sit in the last quarter of the 20th century. American citizens have thrived on freedom and meat and potatoes. We have increased our life span dramatically. Deaths due to heart disease, malnutrition, infectious disease, and most forms of cancer have decreased in incidence. Yet, there are lobbyists on every street corner with a bottle of vitamin pills in one hand and their new diet book in the other, stridently informing anyone who'll listen, that we Americans don't eat right!

A common whipping boy for most of these pseudo-nutritionists has been red meat.

Heather Thomas listened to this barrage of misinformation and took it upon herself to check the facts. This book will not appeal to folks who have made a living espousing no-meat diets. It will, however, be of interest to those doctors, housewives, nutritionists, mothers, teachers and innocent bystanders who wish to separate fact from fiction.

Sealed bids for Painting of 2 Million Gallon Potable Water Storage Reservoir, will be received by the Port of Morrow, Boardman, Oregon, until April 25, 1984 at 2:00 p.m., and then will be publicly opened and read. Bids submitted prior to the opening will be received by Wayne Schwandt, Port Manager, Port of Morrow, P.O. Box 200, Boardman, Oregon 97818.

This contract consists of sandblasting a recently constructed flat bottom, steel water reservoir and painting the interior and exterior which includes approximately 19,000 square feet of exterior surface and 26,000 square feet of interior surface.

Contract documents may be examined and obtained April 9, 1984 at the office of the Port of Morrow, P.O. Box 200, No. 1 Marine Drive, Boardman, Oregon 97818, upon receipt of a refundable deposit of twenty-five dollars (\$25) for each document.

No bid will be considered unless fully completed in the manner provided by the Engineer and accompanied by a bid bond executed in favor of the Port of Morrow, and in an amount not less than ten percent (10 percent) of the total amount of the bid.

In order to be accepted and considered for award of a contract, the Bidder must be qualified in accordance with applicable parts of the Oregon Revised Statutes Chapter 279. Bids shall contain a statement by the Bidder that the provisions required by ORS 279.350 and U.S. Department of Labor (Workmen on Public Works to be Paid Not Less than the Prevailing Rate of Wage) are to be complied with. The bid shall also contain a statement by the Bidder that the Equal Employment Opportunity requirements are to be complied with.

Furthermore, in order to be accepted for award of a contract, the Bidder must be an experienced potable water reservoir painting contractor, who has been in business at least three years. In addition, with the submission of this bid, the Bidder shall submit a brief Company resume showing length of time in business, number of reservoirs painted, type of painting done, and three references of customers that Bidder has painted reservoirs for.

Each proposal must be submitted on the prescribed bid blanks and shall be accompanied by bid security in the form of certified check, cashier's check, or surety bond payable to the Port of Morrow in an
