

Ione thinclads finish 3rd at twilight meet

Under the lights, the Ione boys track team finished third with 54 points at the Wasco County Invitational twilight meet, Friday, April 27 at Wahtonka. The girls team finished tied for 14th with three points.

Throwing the discus 130' 2 1/2" placing first, Randy McCabe set a new meet record. He high jumped six feet for third and pole vaulted 11 feet for third.

Distance runner Mike Douglas broke his own school record in the 3,000 meters running 9:35.7, placing second. He also ran the 1,500 meters in 4:36.0.

Thrower Deena Hams set a new school record in the discus at 88' 10", placing sixth. She was fifth in the javelin at 105' 5 1/2".

Craig Hams long jumped 20' 9 1/2" for second, and triple jumped 39' 11 1/2" for fourth. He sprinted the 100 meters in :11.80, for fourth, and the 200 meters in :24.5, for fifth.

Donnie Doherty heaved the shot 43' 3" for second. Scott Barnett hurled the discus 111' 5 1/2" and the javelin 123' 8".

At 100 meters Chris Rea was timed in :12.8. He hurdled the

110 highs in :18.4, and teamed with Brian Douglas, Eric Cook and Jerry Anderson in the 400 meter relay.

In the 400 and 800 Jerry Anderson showed times of :56.4 and 2:19.1 respectively. Also in the 400, Eric Cook clocked :59.4.

Hurdler Brian Douglas ran the highs :18.9 and the 300 intermediates in :48.4.

Ashley Conklin long jumped 15' 5" and triple jumped 33'

1 1/2". He also ran :28.5 for 200 meters.

Michelle Beeson long jumped, 12' 8", plus running 3:16.7 for 800 meters.

At the first ever Class B State Invitational Track Meet, Saturday, April 28 at Condon, the Ione Boys finished second with 66 points. Christ's Center of Junction City won with 71 points. The Cove girls took that team title, while the Ione girls had 11 points.

Leading the boys were Craig Hams and Randy McCabe. Hams won the long jump at 21' 4 1/2", and won the triple jump at 41' 3 1/2", a new school record. He ran for third in the 200 meters, :24.3 and ran the 100 meters in :11.7.

McCabe won the pole vault at 10' 9". He tossed the discus 121' 10" for third, high jumped

5' 11", fourth and triple jumped 37' 11 3/4", sixth.

For the girls, Deena Hams was second throwing the javelin 120 feet. She was fifth in the discus, 80' 8 1/2", and sixth in the shot put, 28' 7".

Distance runner Mike Douglas ran for sixth in the 1500 meters 4:39.2, and ran 10:01.0 for third in the 3000 meters.

Shot putter Donnie Doherty heaved 43' 7" for second.

Hurdler Chris Rea was fifth in :18.1. Also in the high hurdles Brian Douglas ran 18.6 for sixth. He ran the

intermediates in :47.4. They teamed with Eric Cook and Jerry Anderson to run the 440 yard relay in :51.1.

Discus thrower Scott Barnett heaved for sixth at 104' 2".

High jumper Candi Rudisill did not clear opening height. Jerry Anderson ran the 400 and 800 meters in times of :58.8 and 2:17.3 respectively.

Ione travels to Condon on Saturday, May 5 for the 11 a.m. start of the Big Sky Track Meet. This meet is the final meet before District 7-A Track Meet.
