D.A.'s Report

A year ago Morrow County lost the services of its building inspector, Donald Dale, claiming that he had been wrongfully terminated by the county filed a law suit in December, 1983 claiming damages and suing Morrow County for \$22,000 plus \$7,500 for attorney fees reports County Counsel Mike Oths.

The County Court "duly considered the subject" and filed a counter claim; the county's position was that Dale had quit.

A jury trial began Wednesday, May 2 in Circuit Court at the Morrow County Courthouse in Heppner.

The County Court was asked to consider and subsequently accepted a proposal to "dismiss the lawsuit with prejudice" which means that the parties involved agreed to settle, calling their dispute even; the issue is settled and neither side can re-file.

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Department at the Morrow County Courthouse in Heppner handled the following business during the past week:

On May 1, a Boardman ambulance responded to an injury at the East bound rest area on I-84. An unknown male was transported to Consolidated Good Shepherd Hospital in Hermiston. Oregon State Police, The Dalles is investigating.

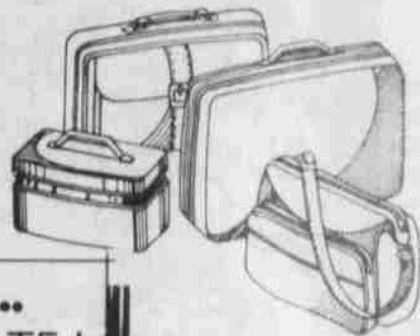
