MCHS to spearhead centennial celebration

Morrow County Court has appointed the Morrow County Historical Society as the committee in charge of spearheading the Morrow County centennial celebration. Delpha Jones will be the chairman of the project, assisted by Ruth McCabe.

The committee's first meeting was Wednesday, May 2. They began planning and will be meeting with the mayors and councils of each of the cities in the county before finalizing their plans, reports Delpha Jones.

The committee hopes to have the celebration stress the progress from 1884 to 1984 in the areas of farming and industry.

Tentatively planned for late August are bus tours between the north and south ends of the county. Hoped for stops in the north end of the county would emphasize modern industry:

the LaCasa de Vin winery, Simplot, and the potato plants.

The hoped-for stops in the south end of the county would emphasize the county's beginnings, the museum, the Courthouse, the ghost town of Hardman, and the modern aspects of the south county: the co-generation plant and the Willow Creek Dam.

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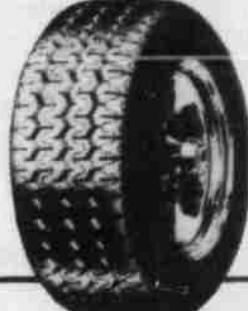
