

Fair board changes meeting dates

The monthly meetings of the Morrow County Fair Board have been changed to the first Monday of each month, which coincides with the Fair Committee meetings, announced a fair board spokesperson. Anyone interested is invited to attend these meetings at the Fair Grounds at 7:30 p.m.

Plans for the upcoming Morrow County Fair and Rodeo include a wide variety of events. Under the leadership of Jane Rawlins, Fair Committee Chairperson, additional landscaping will add to the attractiveness of the grounds. Arts and crafts demonstrations, as well as promotion of agriculture products, will be highlighted. The family night activities include a steak bar-

beque and entertainment with individual, as well as family plan prices.

A major project for the county fair grounds this summer will be the installation of new sewer lines, and tentative plans include making dormitory restrooms more convenient by installing additional furnishings.

Recently the Fair Board reviewed and updated the insurance coverage of the fair grounds. At present, the Fair Board is involved in budget proceedings and the adjustment of having records and data programmed into the county computer system.

Fair Board members, Harold Peck and Merlyn Rob-

inson, attended the Oregon Fairs Association Area IV meeting on May 5 at the Umatilla Fair Grounds.

The Fair Board is receptive to the usage of any activities at the grounds, but encourages advance scheduling to prevent conflicts. The board asks for the cooperation of all, particularly those using grounds for recreation, in keeping litter confined to trash barrels.

4 qualify for state track meet

The boys track team qualified four people at the District 7-A track meet last Friday and Saturday. Those who placed first or second, or met an excellent qualifying standard, will go to the state meet.

The boys team was third with 54 points. The girls were 13th with four points.

Shot putter Donnie Doherty set a new school record winning the shot, throwing 47' 8 3/4".

Randy McCabe, Mike Douglas, and Craig Hams also are going to state. McCabe won the pole vault at 10' 6", Douglas was second in the 3000 meters in a 9:36.7 time, and Hams was third in the long jump (but exceeded the qualifying standard by jumping 20' 8").

McCabe high jumped 5' 10", which tied him for second, triple jumped 38 1/4" for fifth, and he threw the discus 111 ft.

Douglas ran 4:33.0 for sixth in the 1500. Hams triple jumped for third at 39' 11". He also was in the 100 and 200 meters.

The boys final points came in the hurdles. Chris Rea ran the highs in :17.8 for fifth. Rea ran :46.6 for the intermediate preliminaries, a season's best for him. Douglas was in the high hurdle preliminaries.

Deena Hams picked up the girls only points by hurling the javelin 106'5" placing fourth. She also threw the discus 79'7".

Jumper Candi Rudisill made the finals of the long jumping by leaping 14'6". She also high jumped 4'4".

Thrower Scott Barnett made the finals of the javelin by heaving 133'0". He also heaved the discus 108'3", and pole vaulted 8'6".

High jumping 5'8", Howard Leavitt was just short of placing. He long jumped 18'8", just missing the finals.

Jerry Anderson and Eric Cook ran in the 400 and 800 meter preliminaries. Cook ran season's best of :59.3 and 2:23.2 Anderson was just short of making the 800 finals and ran a 3000 meter best of 10:35.0

Thrower Rod Taylor put the shot 33'2" and threw the javelin.

Ashley Conklin long jumped 15'10" and triple jumped 33' 2 1/2". He also ran in the 100 and 200 preliminaries.

The state track meet for those who qualified will be at Lewis and Clark College in Portland on Friday, May 18 and Saturday, May 19. Competition begins at 12:30 p.m. on Friday and 12 noon on Saturday.
