## Local water supply outlook good

As of May 1, 1984 the water supplies are very good for most of Oregon this spring and summer, according to a recent report from the Soil Conservation & National Weather Service. Generally, the snow pack is above, to much above average east of the Cascades. April precipitation was much above normal. Reservoir storage continues to be excellent and April streamflow was very high due to a rapid warming of a heavy snowpack. Water supplies are forecast to be near above average during the next three months. April precipitation was 124 percent of average throughout the area. Amounts received were: Heppner - 1.939 "Ukiah - 1.60."

The mountain snowpack remains above normal. Site: Arbuckle Mtn. Date: 5-1 Water Equivalent: 34.0 Site: Madison Butte - Date: 5-1 Water Equivalent: 6.0 Forecasts of streamflow are as follows: Butter Creek near Pine City - 111 percent average during May-July. Rock Creek near Heppner - 95 percent average during May-July. Willow Creek at Heppner - 100 percent average during May-July. Rock Creek above Cayuse Canyon near Condon - 129 percent average during May-July.
