Initiative petition granted

To the editor:
 The Real Friends of Oregon wish to report that an initiative petition repealing LCDC and returning state land use planning to the cities and counties has been granted.

After much delay caused primarily by the 1000 Friends of Oregon, this petition to put the question of State land use planning and its repeal on the November '84 ballot is now being circulated statewide.

To those folks who object to having the values of their lands appropriated by the State with the present Goals and Guidelines of LCDC, to those who believe land use planning should be done by local elected officials and to those who are fed-up with dealing with a state bureaucracy we extend an urgent invitation to share with us the

chore of securing enough signatures on our initiative petition to qualify the question of repeal for the November ballot.

The delaying tactics leave us only five weeks (July 1) to gather these signatures.

By spreading the effort statewide it can easily be done, but it requires a little effort from each of us. Send your request for a petition sheet with 20 name spaces to PO Box 24, Gold Beach, Oregon 97444, or call 247-6028 and leave your name and address.

When the entire state is being hurt, the healing requires the efforts of all of us.

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Department at the Morrow County Courthouse in Heppner handled the following business during the past week:

10 Years Ago

Ron Daniels, former superintendent of Morrow County Schools, was named President of Blue Mountain Community College to succeed Walter McVae.

Essex Hershman was dubbed the accidental candidate after receiving 61 democratic write-in votes and 80 republican write-in votes in the primary election. Hershman said, "I would never have run for the assessor's office, but with that many people wanting to make the race, I wouldn't feel right if I didn't."

The Heppner Community Kindergarten graduated its final class after 25 years of community kindergartens because kindergarten was to become part of the county school curriculum in the fall.

Hardman and Boardman residents signed petitions and met to oppose the School Board's closure of the Hardman school and the consolidation of the seventh and eighth grades at Boardman with the Irrigon school.

Approval of funds for a resurvey of the Willow Creek dam at Heppner appeared closer as the House Appropriations Committee approved an appropriations bill for the survey.

50 Years Ago
