Corps begins work at Alfalfa St. bridge



The Army Corps of Engineers has torn out the old Alfalfa Street Bridge and is replacing it with a new, larger one, said Herb Bessey of the Corps. The new bridge will allow a greater volume of water to flow underneath which will facilitate waterflow in the outlet channel, that portion of Willow Creek which is between the regular creek channel and Willow Creek dam.

Bank of E.O. asks Ione Council for easement under city park

The Ione City Council met Monday, June 4 and according to City Recorder Diana Starr, conducted the following business:

—heard a request from Gerald Pierson, representing the Bank of Eastern Oregon as legal owners of the 11-unit apartment building on Main street, for an easement to put a drainfield for the building under the Ione City Park. He said that the drainfield would be part of the Bank's effort to upgrade and improve the condition of the building. The Council moved to grant the Bank of Eastern Oregon the easement to establish a drainfield with the condition that the legal costs be incurred by the owners and that the Department of Environmental Quality make a study of the proposed system and report to the council before a legal easement would be signed.

—Linda LaRue, as a representative of the Ione Community and Agri-Business Organization, discussed with the council the main objectives of the organization: to compile a list of available housing in the area, and to open the road connecting Ione and the north end of the county.

—moved to pay Frank Halvorsen for mowing the lawn on city-owned property across from T & C Storage.

—agreed to install a meter and standpipe on property owned by Herb Ekstrom.

—heard a complaint about vehicles stored on the city right of way along property owned by Elmer Holtz. Agreed to draft a letter to Holtz concerning the matter.

—held a public hearing on the 1984-85 budget and passed a resolution to adopt the budget, levy taxes and make appropriations.

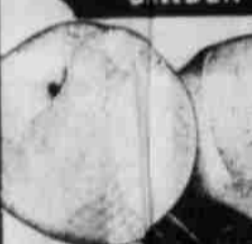
