The Public Works Director, Otto Burden, has submitted the following report of work done by the Morrow County Road Department during the past week:

Morrow County's rock crushing plant is being relocated and set up at a Port of Morrow site in Boardman.

Patching has taken place on Gooseberry, Rhea Creek, Social Bridge, and Keck Canyon Roads.

Three hundred tons of cold patching mix has been made at the Lexington shop.

Blading has occurred on Penland Lake Road, Kincaid-Holtz Roads (from water damage), Spring Hollow, Board Creek, Road Canyon, and Sanford Road.

Little Buttercreek is being prepared for widening and resurfacing. The plan is to widen it to 24' of pavement from Lena to Pine City.

In the Boardman-Irrigon area patching was done on Kunze and Slaughter Roads; blade patching on Utah Street; mowing done on various streets in the Irrigon area.

50 Years Ago
Thursday, July 5, 1934
The American Red Cross closed its Heppner office after providing assistance to 21 families following the May 29 cloudburst and flood. An additional 91 families were contacted by the case workers but reported that they were able to recover damages without assistance.

Chas. W. Smith, who had been Morrow County Agricultural Agent for seven years, received an appointment to the position of assistant director of Agriculture Adjustment Administration work in Oregon.

25 Years Ago
Thursday, July 2, 1959
Morrow County voters approved the school budget by a margin of 458 "yes" votes to 229 "no" votes. This was a revised budget which was almost \$25,000 less than the original budget which was defeated in May.
