## Wilderness management provides challenge

The creation of the North Fork John Day and North Fork Umatilla Wildernesses alters management direction for the 142,000 acres of land within the Umatilla National Forest, and offers unique challenges to the Forest Service, according to Supervisor John E. Lowe, Pendleton.

Wilderness provides for "solitude," "inspiration," and "quality of life," intangibles which are difficult to measure. These abstract kinds of resources require special consideration, and extend distinct opportunities for innovative management, Lowe believes.

"Wilderness is an important resource which fits naturally into the multiple use spectrum," Lowe points out, adding that wilderness as a resource to be managed is not a new concept, but one which now excites attention simply because of the large portion of the Umatilla National Forest involved.

About 21.7 percent of the Forest's total land base is now in designated Wilderness: North Fork John Day, 106,250 acres; North Fork Umatilla, 20,200 acres; and Wenaha-Tucannan, 177,469 acres. Total acreage in Oregon and Washington on the Umatilla National Forest is 1,402,469 acres.

"With over a fifth of the land base in Wilderness, we are challenged to quickly shift gears, reorganize and re-schedule resource use, Forest-wide, and inform the public of new opportunities," Lowe says.

Management of Wilderness is guided by the Wilderness Act of 1964 which directs that "Wilderness is an area where the earth and its community of life are untrammeled by man; where man himself is a visitor who does not remain."

This means few, if any, physical improvements, no motors or motorized equipment, and little evidence of man's presence.

One immediate change in the traditional use of the land within the new Umatilla Wildernesses will be the prohibition of motorized equipment and vehicles. This will include chainsaws, motorcycles and snowmobiles, all of which have been generally acceptable in the past.
