## OWGL picks official cake

Oregon's wheat farmers are co-operating with Oregon's walnut and carrot farmers by featuring Oregon's agricultural commodities in the official Oregon Wheat Growers League 1984 cake recipe, called the "Golden Wheat Carrot Cake." The recipe will be featured at the cake baking contest to be held this year at the Morrow County Fair, according to Vicki Wagenblast who is the county contact person for the OWGL Consumer Programs Committee, who are sponsoring the local county contest.

The Golden Wheat Carrot Cake was chosen because it is relatively inexpensive to prepare and requires a minimum of special ingredients. "This is not an exotic cake," explained Mrs. Wagenblast. "Most all kitchens will have the basic ingredients right in their cupboard, and it features Oregon grown flour, walnuts, and carrots."

The Oregon Wheat Growers League is sponsoring the cake contest at all of Oregon's county fairs in 1984. Additional information about entering the contest can be obtained from the Morrow County extension office located in Heppner. Or, persons may call Vicki Wagenblast, 989-8158 as the local O.W.G.L. county contact person for the contest.

Contest rules are printed in the Morrow County Fair Premium book, available at the County Extension Office and at the Gazette-Times. The cake recipe follows:  
GOLDEN WHEAT CARROT CAKE

- 1 cup oil
- 2 cups sugar
- 2-1/4 cups sifted cake flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 4 eggs
- 3 cups finely grated raw carrots
- 1 cup finely chopped Oregon walnuts

Combine oil and sugar. Mix well. Sift together remaining dry ingredients. Sift half of dry ingredients into sugar mixture. Blend. Sift in remaining dry ingredients alternating with eggs, one at a time, mixing well after each addition. Add carrots and mix well; mix in nuts. Pour into greased and floured 10-inch bundt pan. Bake in slow oven (325 degrees) about one hour, 10 minutes or until done. Cool in pan upright on rack. Remove to serving plate. Serves 24.

## Ore. driver licenses will be different color beginning Aug. 1

Oregon's driver licenses will have a new look starting Aug. 1 when the Motor Vehicles Division will begin issuing licenses and identification cards in a new color and sealed in a new more tamper-proof laminate, according to David P. Moomaw, Administrator.

DMV also will begin issuing photo instruction and special permits Aug. 1, Moomaw says. The paper permits now mailed to applicants from Salem will be discontinued.

Oregon's new licenses and ID cards will be white instead of yellow. The data card will be encased in a laminate which is slightly larger than the current laminate. The word "OREGON" will appear in blue on the left-hand side of the laminate. The background for the photo will continue to be blue for people under age 21 and yellow for those 21 and over.

"The white color for the data card will make information easier to read," Moomaw says, "and the new laminate should further discourage attempts to break the seal on licenses."

Instruction permits and special permits will have the same format as licenses and ID cards and will include a photo. The laminate for permits issued to learners under 22 will include the word "OREGON" in light gold across the driver's personal data - the same as for licenses and ID cards issued to people under 22 years old.

The new format will allow permit applicants to be issued the permit in the field office instead of waiting for a paper permit to be mailed from Salem, Moomaw says.
