Thursday, August 15, 1974

National Weather Service personnel had completed installation of flash flood alarm systems on Shobe Canyon and Balm Fork.

The Morrow County assessor's office announced that it would re-assess the city of Heppner for the 1975-76 tax year.

Bristow's market was broken into Saturday night, Aug. 3. Several cases of beer and bottles of wine were stolen. Don Bristow noted that at least the culprits were neat; they had taken time to clean up the mess from broken beer bottles and put the broken glass in the trash can and the beer-soaked rags in the sink.

Lexington residents approved a \$205,000 general obligation bond issue to upgrade the water system.

25 Years Ago

Thursday, August 13, 1959

Three separate suits had been filed in Morrow County circuit court which sought to prevent the Morrow County School board from making planned changes in the operation of the county's schools at Boardman,

Lexington, and Hardman for the coming year.

The McCormack Construction Company of Pendleton was awarded a contract for the construction of the Morrow County museum and Heppner library building.

50 Years Ago

Thursday, August 16, 1934

Morrow County had been designated as an emergency drought area according to a telegram received from Frederick W. Steiwer, United States Senator.

Total expected wheat crop for the United States was 490,960,000 bushels, down from the averages of previous years, the decline was attributed to the nation-wide drought.

In the "believe it or not" department, the G-T reported that "There appears to be an unfounded rumor over the county that Dr. A.D. Murdoch is moving to Pendleton. How this rumor got started, the doctor does not know as he has never thought of moving, much as mentioned it. There is also an unfounded rumor that the Heppner hospital is closed."
