

## Garden Bugs honor McCarl yard

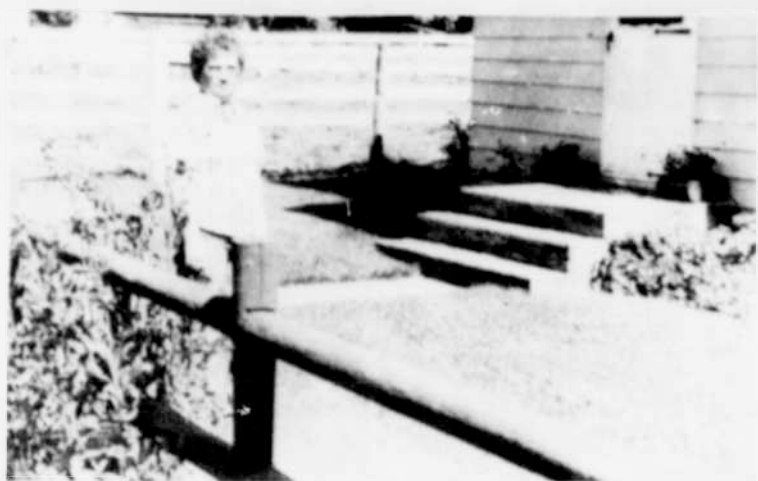
The Lexington Garden Bugs chose the yard of Morris and Shirley McCarl as the Yard of the Month for August said a spokesperson for the club.
