

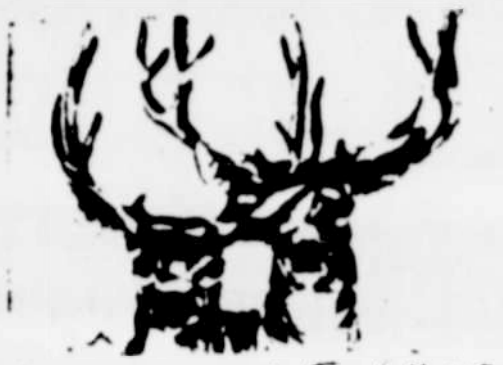
Co. Arts & Crafts club to hold drawing

Oregon MVD releases annual fall statistics

Another 107 young people were denied driving privileges by court order in August.

The Oregon Motor Vehicles Division reported Friday, Sept. 7 that so far this year 621 young people between 13 and 17 years old have been denied driving privileges because they violated alcohol or drug laws.

Minors in possession of alcohol account for most of the denials—nearly 80 percent of the August total.

Minors in possession of drugs resulted in 14 percent of the court ordered denials. An open container of alcohol in a vehicle accounted for the rest of the August denials.

Under the law, denial of driving privileges is for one year or until the person becomes 17, whichever is longer. Repeat offenders are suspended or denied for one year or until the person becomes 18, whichever is longer.

Most of the young people (77)

denied driving privileges last month were males. Denials were handed out to the following age groups:

The law allows a court to withdraw the order after 90 days on the first offense or after one year on a repeat offense.

Oregon vehicle fatalities up from last year

Seventy-five people died in Oregon traffic accidents during August, a 17 percent increase over August of last year when 64 people were killed in traffic, according to the Motor Vehicles Division.

The August toll brought the 1984 count to 391, a 10 percent increase over the 356 traffic deaths recorded during the comparable period a year ago.

The toll for June, July and August

increased nearly 21 percent over the fatalities recorded during the same period a year ago. One hundred and ninety-eight victims died in traffic this summer, compared with 154 killed during the summer months of 1983.

Eight pedestrians and two bicycle riders were among the August victims. Thirteen motorcyclists, only one of whom was known to be wearing a helmet, also were killed in August. One August victim died

when the skateboard he was riding crashed into a motor vehicle.

One child under five died as a passenger in a motor vehicle. This brings to two the number of children who have died since the state's child restraint law took effect on Jan. 1. Last year through August, nine passengers under five had died in traffic.

One August fatality occurred in Morrow County.

Sew with wool contest coming Oct. 20

The rich colors and textures popular this fall offer home sewers the encouragement to sew something beautiful from woolen fabrics, says Ruth McCabe, District Director of Make It Yourself With Wool.

There is still time to create a distinctive fashion and be a part of the annual wool fashion sewing competition. Entry forms are available at Extension offices or from the district director.

The district contest will be staged at the Catholic Parish Hall, Heppner. Judging and a public show will both be completed on Saturday, October 20.

Junior and senior division winners will be eligible to travel to the state contest for valuable prizes which include Bernina sewing machines, scholarships, and a paid trip to the national competition.

There are divisions for pre-teens, ages 10-13; juniors, 14-16; seniors, 17-21; and adults over 21. New this year is a category for garments made of hand woven fabrics.

All entries must be from loomed, knitted, or felted fabrics or yarn of 100 percent wool or of no more than 40 percent synthetic fibers.

Many valuable prizes are provided for the district contest by local businesses and individuals.

Candidates file for election

Filing deadline for the November election has passed. The following candidates have filed with the Morrow County Clerk's office:

For the two-year term of mayor of Heppner, three candidates have filed: Cara Costa, Warren Plocharsky, and Justine Weatherford.

For three Heppner city council positions, only two candidates, Marvin Lane, and Floyd Wilks will be on the ballot.

For the two-year term of mayor of Lone, Wayne Hams is the only candidate who has filed. Three Lone four-year council positions have been filed for by Laurel Cannon, Cleo Childers, and Judy Osmin.

John Ripple is the only one who

filed for the two-year term of mayor of Lexington.

Linda Jones has filed for the four-year term of Recorder-Treasurer of Lexington.

Gary Munkers and Vilas Ropp will be listed on the November ballot for election for one four-year term as a Lexington city council member.

Four four-year Irrigation council positions are up for election. The following have filed: Bob Byron, Donald Eppenback, Caryle Gallien, Robert Judd, and Joel Stahl.

Gale Grill has filed for the four-year term of Boardman's mayor.

Three Boardman four-year council positions are open. The following names will be on the ballot: Jerry Donovan, Raymond Michael, Howard Sakmon, William Sharkey, Gene Trumbull, and Dewey W. West, Jr.

Other local offices to be voted for, for which candidates won the primary election for their political party in May.

For County Commissioner, incumbent Warren McCoy (Rep.), will face Jerry Peck (Dem.).

The county surveyor's race will be between David H. Krumbein, (Rep.) and Earl D. Ming (Dem.).

Four candidates are unopposed for county offices in the coming general election. They include:

County Assessor - Gregory Paul Sweek (Dem.) incumbent, County Clerk - Barbara Bloodsworth (Dem.) incumbent, Morrow County Sheriff - Roy Drago (Dem.) incumbent and Morrow County Treasurer - Margo Sherer (Dem.) incumbent.

For the non-partisan position of Circuit Court Judge, position No. 1 for the Sixth District, Robert Abrams of Heppner is running against David D. Gallaher of Pendleton.

Heppner resident Ray French (Rep.) will be running against Mark Stringer (Dem.) for election to the position of State Representative for District 30.

Mark Stringer (Dem.) and Eugene Timms (Rep.) will be on the ballot for District 30 State Senator.
