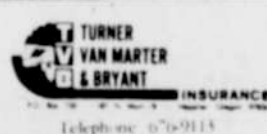

#### Timms praised for work on water review board

To the editor:

The Water Policy Review Board of the state of Oregon is in the process of holding hearings in various parts of Eastern Oregon on establishing or increasing minimum flows on certain streams following recommendations by the State Fish and Wildlife Commission. In many cases the recommended minimum flows exceed the entire flows of the streams in question.

The effect of many of the recommended flows would be not only to prevent any future agricultural development on those streams, but also, in the long run, to reduce the existing agricultural use, since any rights abandoned could never again be activated - even by other irrigators.

As eastern Oregon's only member

of the Water Policy Review Board, I need all the help I can get in trying to protect eastern Oregon interests. Fortunately, I am receiving this support from Senator Gene Timms.

Senator Timms has spent hours studying Oregon water law, and eastern Oregon stream problems. He has participated in all of the important regional meetings. He is one of very few Oregon legislators who has a real understanding of our water problems. Because of his knowledge and leadership, he has developed considerable support for us in the Legislature.

Eastern Oregon very much needs this strong and effective advocate in the Senate.

Wage increases of up to 27 percent were presented to the Morrow County budget and revenue sharing committee last Wednesday by the Pioneer Memorial Hospital Judge Jones flatly rejected this increase.

"We have employees in the courthouse doing more work than the bookkeepers at the hospital, and if the increase were to be granted hospital employees would be earning \$2,000 more per year than our county employees. There could be no justification for such wage differential in the two positions."
