The Sherman County Huskies marched into Heppner Friday night looking for their first win, as was Heppner. Sherman got theirs, but Heppner fell to 0-3.

The Mustangs played their best offensive game this year getting 20 yards on the ground and 35 in the air, but still lost the game 28-0.

Mark Coles, the heralded running back from Sherman was held to 79 yards, combined with tailback Steve Adams 71 yards on the ground. Sherman had 150 yards on the ground.

"Our lack of experience is more of a factor in our inconsistent play so far. We have enough size to stop people as we've proven on several occasions. The key is stopping people consistently and that just takes experience, which we are rapidly acquiring," said coach Craig Kitching.

Things looked bleak at the beginning when Steve Adams took the opening kick-off 80 yards for a touchdown, and Sherman led 7-0 early. Adams scored his second touchdown on a three-yard run in the second quarter to build a 13-0 lead at halftime.

Sherman scored two more touchdowns in the third quarter and added a safety in the fourth for the victory.

The Mustangs face one of the toughest opponents in the CBC in Umatilla.

"Umatilla attacks from all angles and it will be a real challenge for our defense to shut them down. We look forward to playing good teams because that's how we improve our play," said Kitching.
