

Morrow County Centennial Feature Horse thievery surrounds the Cliff Rea Place



In 1886 the barn which sits on the Cliff Rea place was once used in the business of horse thievery. A man, his wife, two sons and a daughter rented the ranch. With the help of two other men, several dozen horses were stolen from the area before neighbors became suspicious. Finally one night the neighbors staked out the ranch and discovered the three men driving the herd towards the Columbia River. The horse thieves had arranged to swim the horses across the river to "Horse Heaven Country" where buyers were waiting for them. The three men were brought back to the ranch on the Cliff Rea place and hung from the limbs of the poplar trees behind the house.
