DO NOT ... Use wood burner as trash incinerator or paper burner.

DO NOT ... Use any flammable fuels to ignite wood including charcoal lighter.

DO NOT ... Extend smoke pipe through walls or ceilings unless proper installation procedures are followed. (Refer to illustrations)

DO NOT ... Do anything that will cause sudden change of temperature in stove.

DO NOT ... Connect a wood stove to a fireplace chimney unless the fireplace has been sealed off.

DO NOT ... Ever leave the fire to burn unattended or overnight. A wood burning heater is not an automatic device and needs constant attention.

Do... Make sure your fire insurance is up-to-date
