Some state parks to close for winter October 27

The last night of camping in 40 Oregon State Park facilities which close for the winter months will be Saturday, Oct. 27, according to Steve Johansen, operations manager for state parks.

Johansen said that the 40 campgrounds will close for the season on Sunday, Oct. 28, although 10 overnight parks remain open year around for those who enjoy winter camping.

The 1985 season will begin on April 12, he said. Two or three parks traditionally open a number of loops for those who camp each year during the school spring break in March.

Reservations for the 1985 season will be accepted beginning Monday, Jan. 14. Reservations can be made at 13 specific parks for the period between Memorial Day and Labor Day. Reservations must be in writing or in person at the appropriate park. "In person" reservations are not recommended during the winter months since office staff may not be present.

Johansen said that most state park day use areas remain open year around, except where weather or special conditions prohibit, while the following overnight campgrounds are also available throughout the off-season months:

Beverly Beach, near Newport; Bullards Beach, Bandon; Cape Lookout, Tillamook; Champoeg, Newberg; Farewell Bend, Ontario; Fort Stevens, Astoria; Harris Beach, Brookings; Hilgard Junction, LaGrande; J.M. Honeyman, Florence; and Valley of the Rogue, Grants Pass.

The 13 parks where reservations will be accepted for next season beginning Jan. 14 include:

Beverly Beach, South Beach and Beachside, all in the Newport area; Cape Lookout, Tillamook; Detroit Lake, Detroit; Devil's Lake, Lincoln City; Fort Stevens, Astoria; Harris Beach, Brookings; Honeyman, Florence; Prineville Reservoir, Prineville; Sunset Bay, Coos Bay; Cove Palisades, Culver; and Willowa Lake, Joseph.
