This was the Fillies last home volleyball game so it started out with a few presentations. The senior players; Jodi Padberg, Janelle McElhany, Stephani Payne and Ellen Arbogast, received special recognition. Then they presented flowers to their parents. Following this the Heppner fillies presented coach Stefani; Bookkeeper and helper, Jean Strange; and manager Val Hager with flowers.

Heppner went out on the court ready to begin. The exceptionally large number of fans got the Fillies fired up and Heppner started the first game with a good serve. The Fillies also received the first point. Heppner was really hustling and going after the ball. There were long volleys between the two teams. Both teams were serving very well. Weston McEwen gave Heppner a few hard serves and Heppner had a bit of trouble receiving the ball, but they stayed in there and fought hard. The lead changed back and forth between the two teams. Heppner pulled ahead of the TigerScots 10-8 and Weston McEwen called a time out. Heppner played very well and very smart up at the net. They gained many points from blocks and spikes from the front row. The lead continued to switch from team to team after each serve until Heppner was in the lead 15-14 and Weston McEwen was serving. Heppner returned the ball and the TigerScots weren't ready so the serve was turned back over to Heppner. Heppner served and Weston McEwen

returned the serve. Heppner set the ball up and sent a good hard spike back to Weston McEwen to win the first game with a final score of 16-14.

As the crowd continued to cheer, the TigerScots served a good serve and received the first point of the second game. Heppner didn't let this discourage them; they stayed in there and stopped the serve. Heppner was really hustling and communicating. The Fillies pulled ahead of the TigerScots 6-4 when Weston McEwen called a time out. Heppner went back in and pulled as well. They were serving very well. Heppner had a lot of bump, sets and hard spikes down to Weston McEwen, which gained them quite a few points. There were again very long volleys and excellent hustle with the score 12-4 Heppner had the serve. The serve was over and Weston McEwen returned it to the Fillies. Heppner was ready and sent it back to Weston McEwen scoring another point. Again Heppner served the ball and Weston McEwen couldn't return it. The score was now 14-5. Heppner served for the winning point. The TigerScots returned the ball. A long volley was played and finally Heppner sent a spike back over to Weston McEwen, which they weren't able to return. Heppner scored and won the game. The crowd went wild. The Heppner Fillies had earned a place in district competition.

PUBLIC NOTICE

The Morrow County Court has declared the following weeds as Noxious and each person, firm or corporation owning or occupying land within the county shall destroy or prevent the seeding on such land.

"A" List: Noxious Weeds
 Skeleton Weed (Chondrilla juncea), Yellow Star Thistle (Centaurea solstitialis), Tansy ragwort (Senecio jacobaea), Dalmatian & yellow toad-flax (Linaria spp.), Mediterranean Sage (Salvia aethiops), Leafy spurge (Euphorbia esula), Spikeweed (Centromadia pungens), Musk thistle (Carduus nutans).

When the provisions of this ordinance are not being complied with, the Weed Inspector shall serve a written notice to the owner or occupant of the land. If the inspector is unable to personally serve the owner or occupant, the inspector shall post the notice in three conspicuous places on the land. If the owner or occupant of property fails or refuses to immediately destroy or cut noxious weeds after being notified by personal service or posting, the Weed Inspector shall immediately notify the District Attorney who shall take necessary steps for enforcement.

The Morrow County Court has declared the following weeds of Economic Importance. The owner or

occupant of property is required to make every practical attempt to eradicate weeds of economic importance, and to prevent their spread.

"B" List: Weeds of economic importance
 Poison Hemlock (Conium maculatum), Canada Thistle (Cirsium arvense), Scotch Thistle (Onopordum acanthium), Jointed Goatgrass (Aegilops cylindrica), St. Johnswort (Hypericum perforatum L.), Perennial sowthistle (Sonchus arvensis), Field bindweed (Convolvulus arvensis), Cereal rye (Secale cereale), Wild oats (Avena fatua), Johnsongrass (Sorghum halepense), Knap weeds-Russian (Centaurea repens), Diffused (Centaurea diffusa), Spotted (Centaurea maculosa), Dodder (Cuscuta spp.), Medusahead Rye (Elymus caput-meduseae), Puncturevine (Tribulus terrestris), Purple loosestrife (Lythrum salicaria), Whitetop (Cardaria draba).


If the owner or occupant of property fails to make every practical attempt to eradicate weeds of economic importance, and to prevent their spread, a fine not to exceed \$500 for each offense can be issued. Jurisdiction for prosecution of this ordinance shall be with the Justice Court. Copies of Ordinance No. MC-C-4-84 can be obtained at Morrow County Court House.
