

JV season ends with match at Weston-McEwen

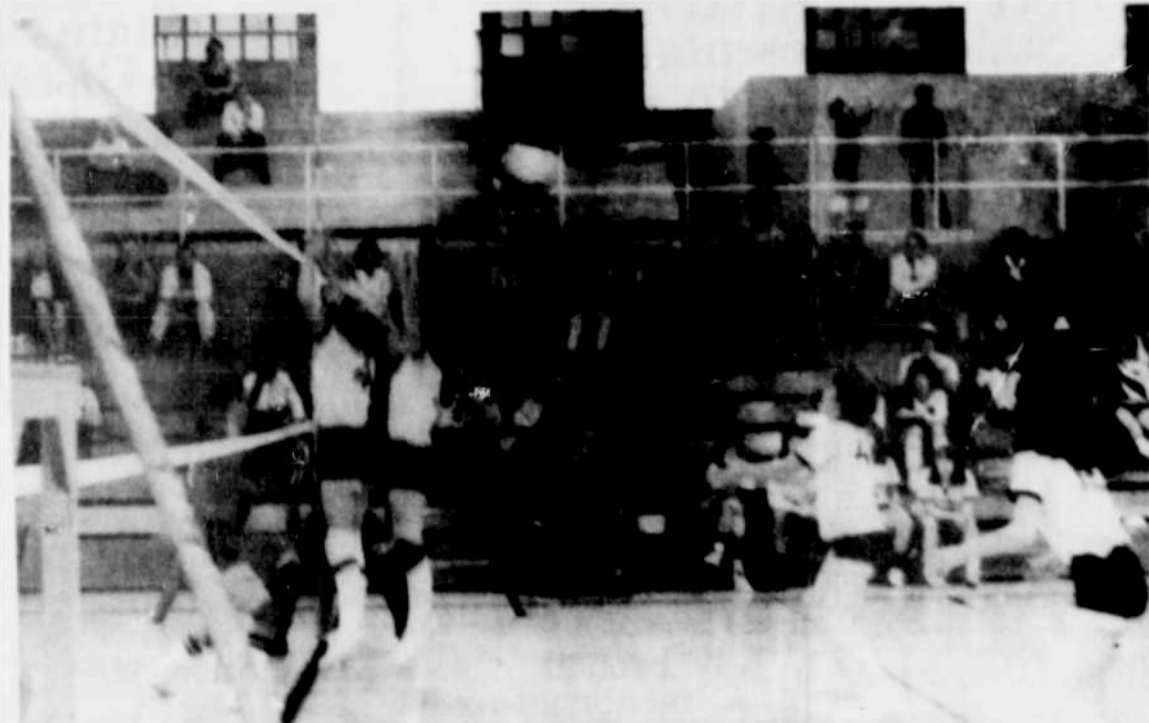
