

Cards soar over Falcons 32-zip in season final

The lone football team finished with a 3-2 record in the Big Sky Conference and a 4-3 mark overall with a 32 to 0 win over the Wheeler Co. Falcons on Friday, Nov. 2.

Game conditions were windy and rainy with the temperatures in the thirties. The Cardinals took the opening kickoff and took an 8-0 lead when Jeff Ball ran in from two yards out and Rod Taylor ran in the extra points.

In the second period, Mark Meyers threw a 37-yard strike to Randy McCabe. After Meyers dashed for two, lone went up 16-0. Chris Rea broke loose for a 30-yard scoring jaunt and Meyers threw to McCabe for a 24 point lead in the third quarter.

Freshman Ken Snider dove in from a yard out and Ball added the extra points as the Cards won 32-0.

lone, Condon and Echo finished the season in a three-way tie for second place. Echo placed fourth with only six Auzzi points. Condon and lone had each earned eight Auzzi points, however Condon won the game versus lone, so lone placed third and Condon received the second place berth for the district playoffs.

The Cardinals gained 313 yards of total offense. lone gained 232 yards rushing and 81 passing.

Meyers completed four of five passes for 81 yards. Mike Rietmann caught two passes for 41 yards and McCabe grabbed two for 40 yards.

Ball rushed 10 times for 91 yards.

Rea added 56 yards on seven tries. Meyers led lone's defense with 19 tackles. Donnie Doherty added 15 tackles, while Snider had 14 and Ball 13.

The Falcons gained 117 yards of total offense. Quarterback Bob Thomas carried 11 times for 61 yards, as Wheeler gained 101 yard on the ground and 16 in the air. Jason Shaffer returned three kicks for 79 yards.

Seniors on this year's team who played the final game of their high school career Friday night were Meyers, McCabe, Doherty, Ball, Paul Zinter, and Eric Cook.

For the season, Meyers completed 47 of 95 passes for 730 yards and 12 touchdowns. McCabe caught 25 passes for 393 yards and 10 touchdowns. Rietmann grabbed 12 passes for 189 yards.

Also for the season, Meyers rushed 112 times for 475 yards. Ball gained 387 yards on 60 attempts and Rea added 305 yards on 64 rushes.

Meyers concluded the season with 92 tackles. Doherty led the team with seven quarterback sacks.

"We had a very up and down season." With all elements considered, I feel we had a successful one," stated head coach Ron Mack who also said that lone's strong point this season was defense. He credited assistant coach Del LaRue with doing an outstanding job with the Cardinal defense.

Mustangs shut-out by Tigers for a 0-9 season

The Heppner Mustangs finished their season last Friday night at Stanfield losing 20-0 and finishing their season winless at 0-9.

The Tigers drew first blood on a 32-yard touchdown pass from Jeff Walker to Joel Mitchell and led 7-0 after the first quarter. Howard Wagener scored the second touchdown on a seven yard run, but the extra point was missed and Stanfield led 13-0 at the half.

Brent Morris scored the final touchdown for Stanfield in the third quarter and the Tigers finished at 3-6.

"The only major disappointment this year would have to be that our seniors don't have a win or two to look back on," said Coach Craig Kitching. "By the same token the way they hung in, and worked to get the job done, regardless of the record, really speaks well for them."

The Tigers had 236 total yards compared to 70 for the Mustangs.

Wagener led the Tigers with 122 yards rushing. The Mustangs secondary did exceptionally well holding the Tigers passing attack to 47 yards on a 3-12 effort. Mustang Quarterback Joe Taylor was 4-9 passing for 28 yards.

The Mustangs could have a successful season next year if the players grow physically and mentally towards the game of football, play together as a unit, work harder than they ever have worked, play tenacious defense, and perform well at the offensive level. If these things come together in 1985, look for the Mustangs to be a very exciting football team next year.
