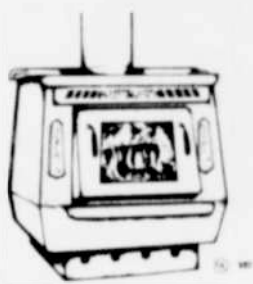
50 Years Ago
