Samantha Henry faces 2nd cancer operation

A trust fund has been started for Samantha Henry's family to help with the mounting medical costs. Samantha has a rare form of cancer not found in a child before. The only way to remove it is through surgery. This surgery is to be done at the University of Oregon's Health Sciences Center Hospital in Portland. One malignant growth in Samantha's throat was surgically removed last month and another one is growing back says Barbara Davis, the child's aunt.

Mrs. Henry was happy to have a new job this fall. Six days later, Samantha needed surgery. Mrs. Henry had to quit her job to be with her daughter. Mr. Henry had been out of work for a year from an accident which caused back injuries. This spring he had heart complications which forced him to need hospitalization and a lot of medical care. The medical expenses are mounting. The family has no insurance. It takes money to run back and forth to Portland, to call the hospital; these bills are mounting also. Samantha needs medication. Other expenses of the family are a real concern.

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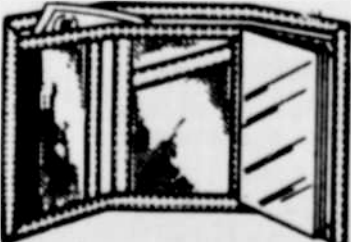
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
