Famine relief P.O. box opened

The Heppner Seventh-day Adventist Church has announced that the Adventist Development and Relief Agency (ADRA) has set up a special post office box expressly for the needs of the people who are suffering from the current famine in Ethiopia. Any funds sent to his address will be used only for the Ethiopia relief project says a spokesperson for the Church: ADRA, P.O. Box 60808, Washington, D.C. 20039. The spokesperson reminds that contributions are tax deductible.

ADRA is busy working in Ethiopia to help with immediate needs as well as long range needs of the people there. 12,000 pounds of medicine,

105,000 pounds of blankets, tents and clothing, and 50 tons of nutritional biscuits have arrived to be distributed said the spokesperson.

The feeding centers are located in the bush country and the greatest concern is transportation to these sights. More four wheel drive vehicles are needed. The ADRA in Ethiopia is attempting to educate the natives in irrigation and other agricultural methods to help meet long range goals of helping them to learn to help themselves.

Various Airline companies are giving good rates to help transport food and medicine to the country, but there is still a need for funds for this air freight of goods concluded the church spokesperson.
