Again, in the third quarter, each team scored four points. The Cards led 22-14 after three.

Padberg topped lone, scoring ten points. Morter added eight to the Cardinal cause.

Eric Pointer and Jerry Anderson each scored five third quarter points as the Cardinals pulled to within one point 27-26.
In the fourth period, lone outscored Condon 15 to eight, to win by a count of 41 to 35. Chris Rea tossed in six points for the Cards in the period. Troy Laney kept Condon close, also scoring six in the period.
