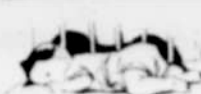


Letters to the Editor

Concerned about Pioneer Memorial

To the people of Heppner:
I was born in the Heppner area and lived my early years here. I have multiple sclerosis. I am 66 years old and I require the care that a six month old child requires. I cannot even press the button to summon a nurse to help me meet my needs. I have asked my niece to write this letter for me.
I have just spent several days at Pioneer Memorial Hospital. The care, concern and love shown by the total hospital staff has overwhelmed me. I have been in V.A. hospitals from the East coast to the West coast. And I've been in numerous civilian hospitals. They were all good, but nowhere did I receive the kind of care I received here.
For quite a few years we lived in Umatilla. The little hospital there came the closest to Pioneer Memor-

ial Hospital. I urge all people of the community and surrounding areas to get in and fight to keep your hospital. If you have the time, contact people of Umatilla and find out what the loss of their hospital has meant to them. This is a dear, wonderful place. You should be very proud of it and get out and support it.
I want to thank everyone; Dr. Koznek, the nurses and aides, the cooks, the office staff and the maintenance staff for what I can only call "loving care."
I have to count my blessings in different ways than most folks and I want to say that if I didn't have multiple sclerosis I wouldn't have had this opportunity to find a whole bunch more people to love.
