NOTICE OF SERVICE OF PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX WARRANTS

Buy Sno-Park permits at DMV

Oregon Sno-Park permits went on sale Thursday, Nov. 1 in all Motor Vehicles Division field offices, most ski areas, and many winter recreation resorts, ski shops and sporting goods stores reports the Oregon Department of Transportation.

The permits are required on vehicles parked in all areas posted as "Winter Recreation Area" between Nov. 15 and April 30. Most downhill ski areas and cross country and snowmobile trailheads have been designated winter recreation areas. The only major downhill ski area

where Sno-Park permits are not required is Mt. Bachelor near Bend. Several other parking locations in the Bend area still require the permits.

Two types of permits are sold. A daily permit costs \$2. An annual permit sells for \$9. Money collected from Sno-Park permit sales is used by the Highway Division to plow parking lots and roadside parking strips used by winter sports enthusiasts concludes the Motor Vehicles Division news release.

Cardinal girls lose to Fillies after 2-game winning streak

Ione's girls basketball team had a two-game winning streak snapped by the Heppner Fillies on Friday, Dec. 28 with a score of 38 to 26.

Neither team could manage much offense as the Fillies took a six to one lead after one period. In the second quarter, Heppner blew the game open by scoring 19 points to Ione's six. Lana Reid tossed in eight for Heppner in the quarter. At the break, the Fillies were ahead of the Cardinals 25-7.

Each team produced nine third period points, as Heppner's lead was 34-16. Reid scored six in the period. Ione grabbed the fourth quarter

10-4, but lost 38 to 26.

Reid was the game's high scorer with 16 points. Deena Hams netted 12 for the Cards.

At the foul line Ione shot 35 percent making eight of 23 attempts. Heppner only made two of 16 shots for 13 percent. From the field, the Cardinals were nine for 32, making 28 percent.

Ione took down 28 rebounds with Sandi Wright getting 13. Hams had seven boards and three assists. Patty McElligott had three steals. The Cards also committed a season-high 36 turnovers.
