

Cardinal girls fall to 49-63 Grizzly roar

The lone girls basketball team fell 63 to 49 on Friday, Jan. 11 to the Helix Grizzlies. At the end of the opening period Helix went ahead 14-10. Nikki Lambake and Jennifer Howdyshell each tossed in six for Helix, while Sandi Wright countered with 10 for Lone.

The Grizzlies had a 19 to 12 advantage during the second quarter for a 33 to 22 advantage at halftime. Deena Hams had 12 for the Cardinals, while Lembecke had nine more for the Grizzlies.

Lembecke put in 12 more inside to power Helix to a 16-12 margin in the third period, as Helix increased its margin to 49-34.

Hams got nine in the fourth quarter to lead Lone to taking the quarter 15-14. However, the Grizzlies grabbed the game 63 to 49.

Hams topped the Cards gunning in 23, as Wright scored 18 more. Lembecke proved unstoppable inside as she led all scorers with 27.

Lone shot 53 field goals and made 16 for a 30 percent rate. Lone hit 52 percent of their free throws, making 17 of 33. Helix shot 53 percent, attempting 17 and connecting on nine.

The Cards took down 24 rebounds. Hams snared nine and Wright hauled in eight. Hams also passed out for five assists and stole the ball seven times. The Cards turned the ball over 31 times.

Cards mauled by Grizzlies 81-41

Lone's boys basketball team suffered its worst defeat of the season on Friday Jan. 11 to the Helix Grizzlies 81-41. The Grizzlies took advantage of many Cardinal turnovers in the first quarter to get their fast break rolling. At the end of the first quarter Helix was up 20-6.

In the second period, the Grizzlies continued to run on the Cardinals by outscoring them 23 to 10. At halftime, the Grizzlies were ahead 43-16. In the period, Craig Newton and Chris Rees had put in six apiece for the Grizzlies.

After three quarters of play, Helix had increased their margin to 62-22, by controlling the third quarter 19-6.

Each team produced 19 points in the fourth period, as Helix won 81 to 41. Chuck Boyer tossed in 10 in the period for Helix.

Lone's Randy McCabe led all scorers with 15 points. Jim Porter led a balanced Grizzly attack with 14 points.

The Cardinals were out rebounded 41-35. McCabe grabbed 20 for the Cardinals. The Grizzlies had 27 assists to Lone's 15, a key statistic to Helix's fastbreak. McCabe, Donnie Doherty, Mark Meyers, Jeff Ball, and Chris Rea each handed out three assists for the Cards. Another key statistic to the Grizzly fastbreak,

was Lone's 18 first-half turnovers and 29 overall.

Helix was red hot from the field, making 53 percent, on 32 of 60 attempts. Meanwhile, Lone made 19 of 69 for 28 percent. At the foul line, the Cards shot 60 percent, making three of five shots. Helix connected on 11 of 18 for 61 percent.
