

Ione girls lose 43-31 match to Echo

From the field, the Cardinals made 10 of 48 shots for 21 percent. At the foul line, the Cards made 11 of 25, 44 percent, compared to 5 of 11, 45 percent, for the Cougars.
Ione grabbed 37 rebounds. Hams and Sandi Wright collected 11 and 10 respectively. Hams also had four assists and four steals. Patty McElligott also had four steals.
The Cardinals play at 6 p.m. on Friday, Jan. 25 at Arlington. Ione then hosts Wheeler on Saturday, Jan. 26 at 6 p.m.

Rockets shoot past Mustangs 58-25

The Pilot Rock Rockets were red hot Friday night, led by Ken Kiehl and Dave Post who combined for 35 points leading the way to their fourth league victory and handing Heppner their fifth straight defeat 58-25.
The Mustangs offense never got rolling and fell behind 12-6 after the first quarter. The second quarter was much of the same, led by Post's six points and the outside shooting of Kiehl were up by eleven 24-13 at the half.
"We need to be more aggressive offensively," said Mustangs Coach Brent Eggers, "the biggest problem is our passing ability, our ball handling has really hurt us too."

Todd Lindsay came out in the third quarter and scored six of the seven points in the quarter, but the defense couldn't stop the Rockets, as Pilot Rock scored 20 points in the fourth period and closed out the game winning by 33 points.
"Our defense was pretty good until we were forced to change the tempo into a full court game. I thought we had a lot better intensity than we've been getting," said Eggers.
The Rockets shot 48 percent from the floor connecting on 25 of 52 shots. Heppner was 10 of 31 from the floor and five of twenty-one from the charity stripe.
Steve Currin and Lindsay were the top scorers with six points apiece, Keith Kenison had ten rebounds for

Heppner. Kiehl and Post had 21 and 15 points respectively for the winners. Turnovers hurt Heppner, however, as they had 32 for the game.

The Stanfield Tigers handed the Heppner Mustangs their sixth straight defeat in league play last Saturday night 44-22.
Heppner could get nothing going against the league's toughest defense and only managed two points in the first period, as they fell behind quickly 12-2. The Mustangs attempted to close the gap in the second, but gained only seven points as they found it almost impossible to get the ball inside and fell behind at the half 24-9.
"I think the defense has come a long way, but the offense has regressed. As we face better competition, we just aren't getting the ball inside at all,"

said Heppner Coach Brent Eggers.
Heppner tried to stage somewhat of a comeback in the third period and played pretty good defense but were still down by 17 at the end of the third. And eventually lost by 22 at the end of the game.
The Mustangs did hold Stanfield's top man Jed Hummel to eight points, and the Tigers shot only 40 percent from the field hitting 20-50.
"As a whole, our defense showed a lot of improvement this weekend. It was a good showing against Stanfield," said Eggers.
Heppner found the mark on seven shots against Stanfield the majority from the outside as the Mustang Postmen could only gather six points. Todd Lindsay and Wayne

Wilgers had six points, each for Heppner. Ken Graves grabbed five rebounds.
Shawn MacPherson led the way for Stanfield with 19 points. The Mustangs host Umatilla and Wahlonka next weekend, game time at 7:30 p.m.

There was not much smoke damage, Burkenbine said. The fire was confined mainly to an outside wall, the roof and ceiling. The stove pipe was installed prior to the Osmins' purchase of the house concluded the fire chief.
