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## School Board tables request

The Morrow County School Board handled the following business at its March 18 meeting:

- Tabled action on a request to establish a community library in the upstairs classroom of the district office in Lexington as the representative of the group interested in this project was not present at the meeting.

- Heard representatives of the Morrow County Fair and Rodeo request use of the school district bus shop area for parking camp trailers, and access to the livestock barns during the fair and rodeo week. Directed the administration to explore various alternatives to this proposal to present to the April school board meeting since this time is very crucial for completing summer maintenance work on the district bus fleet.

- Hear a report on the Read-a-Thon at AC Houghton Elementary from Mick Tolar. Over \$2000 was contributed to two benefit activities. Heard reports from Jan Sharp, Leslie Caldwell and Bob Deeter on the academically talented program activities at their respective schools.

- Heard reports of recent vandalism at Sam Boardman Elementary and Heppner Elementary Schools.

- Heard a summary of filings for school board and advisory committee positions to be voted on at the school district election on March 26.

- Approved a revised fairgrounds use agreement for a three year period. The agreement specifies maintenance and cleaning responsibilities and provides for the district to make a payment of \$2000 to the county for its use of the facilities.

- Approved special field trip requests for the Riverside High journalism class and for the Heppner High advanced placement Language Arts class.

- Heard the superintendent report that suggestions for policy revisions have been requested from the district staff.

- Examined four proposed calendars and heard that the district staff favors plan C. The board deferred action to adopt a calendar until April pending study of the proposals and receipt of input from the public.

- Granted permission for Columbia Junior High to play one additional baseball game to enable Heppner Junior High to have a total of four games in its season. It was noted that very few area junior highs are continuing to offer a junior high baseball.

- Approved notification of probationary teachers of intention to renew or not renew contracts for 1985-86 as recommended by the administration.

- Approved coaching assignments as follows: David Sinkevitch, Asst. Baseball and Brent Eggers, Asst.

The Morrow County Creative Arts and Crafts Association has announced that Addy Calbeck won the oil painting, "Solitude," which was donated by Pauline Matheny. The drawing was held Saturday, March 16 following the art club's sale and showing. A spokesperson for the club reports that the winner was "delighted" with her painting. Proceeds from the drawing were added to other Association funds to pay a two-thirds share (\$74), of the salary for the Heppner artist in residence. The other one-third of the salary, \$288, was paid by the Eastern Oregon Regional Arts Council.

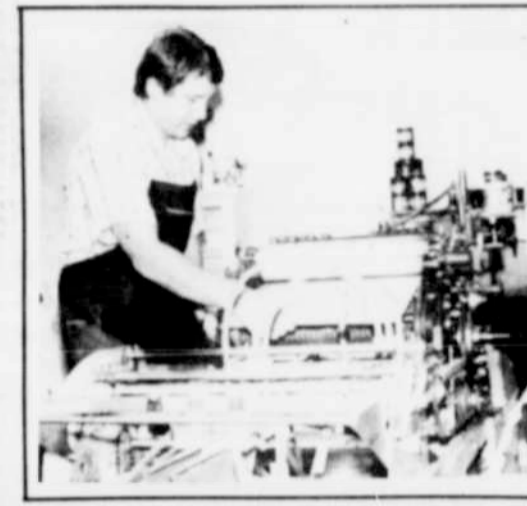
