The month saw some top activities here as its first days were filled with the excitement of the state basketball tournament in Pendleton where the Heppner High Fillies thrilled everyone with their fine play and outstanding sportsmanship.

The month's middle saw the biggest and best St. Patrick's Day celebration ever in Heppner thanks to many folks, especially Jimmy Farley whose inspirational work led into the revival of Irish glory and to that lovely old sun that rolled around heaven that Saturday and Sunday.

Last Saturday, on March's 30th night, the whole county should be thrilled at having the 1985 Fair and Rodeo Court installed at an outstanding ceremony. Queen Bridgett and her four princesses and their five pennant bearers made a delightful appearance, and we feel they will lead many home folks and friends from surrounding areas to come to enjoy the August fair and rodeo.

Viva Villanova! Monday night the two top Big East Basketball Conference teams really put on a tremendous show as the underdog Villanova Wildcats overcame the strong Georgetown Hoyas 66 to 64. Georgetown led 20 to 14 at one time, the Wildcats had a one point lead at halftime, and their amazing 78 per cent field goal shooting (the best ever in a NCAA finals) brought them the national title and their center Pinckney won most valuable player over Georgetown's super center Ewing.

This project really got underway last fall when Perry Cooper was here leading the scouts. Linda Shaw and other scout-leading adults and all the scouts have been eagerly looking forward to the realization of the project as have many citizens who have been so hopeful that the old cross would be at least repainted.

In recent weeks a new cross has been put together and painted in the Glenn Cooper trucking company shop. Of course, adverse weather has prevented any installation during the last several months. Now on these warm days of Holy Week it is hoped that the new cross will be replacing the weatherworn, rugged old one which sits on the magnificent viewpoint east of town on the high spot of Don and Merlyn Robinson's land. We understand that Perry Cooper is coming home from Texas this week and may attend the installation of the new cross.

As Anna Mae Steagall declared recently, and as most of us know, the viewpoint and the cross are more visible to more people now from the re-located Willow Creek road than they were formerly. For several Easter Sunday's several of us have made our annual treks to this lovely spot.

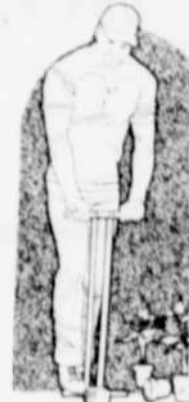
