

Jepsens yard awarded for Apr Sheriff's Report News from Arizona Band Festival set April 16

Ione Garden Club has chosen the yard of John and Jean Jepsen for the first garden of 1983. Mr. and Mrs. Jepsen purchased the home 25 years ago from the Dobyns and have lived here with their two children Jim, a student at Mt Hood Community College, and Judy, a seventh grader at Ione Jr. High.

There are pine and evergreen trees around the fences and yard, and these are all trimmed, as are the shrubs around the house. The fruit trees are neatly shaped and trimmed.

Since the Jepsens are in the pest control business, much of the weed control and bug control is done with use of insecticides and around the fences and hard to get places to weed with ground sterilants.
