Ione's boys and girls track teams competed in a five-way track meet on Tuesday, April 9 with Heppner, Umatilla, Riverside, and Ukiah.

Boys team scores were: Riverside 78, Umatilla 73, Ione 55, Heppner and Ukiah 26.

Team scores for girls were: Heppner 64, Ukiah 59, Umatilla 52, Riverside 25, and Ione 21.

Donnie Doherty broke his own school record in the shot put, with a winning put of 48' 9". He was on the 440 yard relay team of Chris Rea, Eric Cook, and Brian Douglas that placed third in :51.5. He was also on the mile relay team of Cook, Tim Beeson and Douglas that ran 4:11.7 for second.

Rea gained a fifth place in the 100

yard dash in :11.6. Douglas was third in the 120 yard high hurdles (:17.8) and third in the 180 yard low hurdles (:25.0).

Cook sprinted 1:00.0 for 440 yards, gaining fourth place. He also threw the javelin 107' 8".

yards. In the 880 yard run, he was third at 2:44.4. Long jumping, he went 12' 8".

Thrower Gary Rea grabbed a fourth in the discus at 88' 0". He also put the shot 30' 9".

In the 220 yard dash, Ashley Conklin was fourth running 27.7. He ran the 100 in :12.5, long jumped 16' 5 1/2" and triple jumped 34' 3 1/2".

Kierin Doherty was third, running the two mile in 14:14.1. He heaved the shot 27' 4" and long jumped 13' 8".

Both the Ione boys and girls track teams participated in the 17th annual Morrow County Invitational track meet on Saturday, April 13. 21 schools competed in one of the premier track meets in Eastern Oregon. Enterprise captured the boys title with 79 points and Heppner grabbed their second straight girls title with 66 points. Ione's boys team placed fifth with 42 points, while the girls were tenth with 13 points.

Seven meet records were set and two tied.

For the second week in a row, Randy McCabe won the pole vault at 12 feet. He added a second place triple jumping 40' 6" and a third, tossing the discus 122' 6". He was also on the fifth place 1600 meter relay team of Eric Cook, Chris Rea, and Brian Douglas that ran 3:51.6.

Shot putter Donnie Doherty heaved the shot 47' 1/2" for second.

Thrower Deena Hams threw the javelin 108' 3" for second place. She gained a fourth in the shot put at 31' 6 1/2" and a sixth in the discus at 88' 7".

Douglas placed third in the 110 meter high hurdles and fifth in the 300 meter intermediate hurdles. He ran times of :17.3 and :44.7 respectively. He also ran on the 400 meter relay team of Rea, Cook, and Tim Beeson that ran :50.3.
