

# Heppner girls capture team title at Morrow County invitational

Heppner High School tracksters turned in outstanding individual performances at the 17th annual Morrow County Invitational track and field meet at Umatilla last Saturday against what was probably the toughest competition the locals

will face until the state A meet. Earning four blue ribbon finishes the girls captured the team title for the second year in a row despite being short-handed. Team scores were Heppner 66, Umatilla 60, Weston-McEwen and Enterprise 55, Joseph 36, Wasco County 33, Imbler

28, Wahtonka 28, Pilot Rock 24, Echo 17, Ione 13, Grant Union and Helix 10, Arlington 6, Stanfield 5, Spray and Riverside 4, Wallowa and Wheeler County 1 and Condon 0. Stephanie Payne was a double winner collecting firsts in the 100 with a time of :12.7, the fastest

reported in the state for Class A runners, and in the 200 with a time of :27.2. Janelle McElhany ran :17.8 in the high hurdles to win that event. Jodi Padberg, running the 1500 meters for the first time this season, turned in a 5:29.9, fastest in the district this year, to capture first and teammate Cathy Martin lowered her time by over 12 seconds to collect second in the same race.

and just missed placing; Shannon McLaughlin who turned in a season's best in the discus and Cherie Hager, competing in strong field in both the shot put and discus. The boys team was able to muster only three place finishes but faced outstanding competition as eight meet records were broken or tied in the boys events. Scott Buschke earned a fourth place tie in the high jump and Wayne Wilgers tied for sixth in the same event. Both jumped 5-8. Jason Palmer collected the other ribbon by throwing 117-2 in the discus for sixth place and set a personal record in the shot put with a distance of 36-11.

Chris McLaughlin also got a personal record and the H.S. junior class mark in the 300 meter hurdles with a :45.9 clocking. He failed to place in either hurdles race but ran well. Jason Dougherty found himself in exceptionally strong events as meet records and state bests were recorded in each of the events he entered. Heppner travels to John Day this weekend for an invitational meet at Grant Union and will be in Hermiston for a triangular meet next Tuesday against Riverside and Hermiston.
