Ione completes season at 39th State track meet

Ione's track teams completed their season at the 39th annual Class "A" Track and Field State Meet at Mt. Hood Community College in Gresham on Friday, May 17 and Saturday, May 18.

Ione's boys track team did not score, while the Ione girls tied with North Douglas and Warrenton for 19th place with six points. Enterprise took the boys title with 45 points followed by St. Mary's with 34. Kennedy captured the girls crown with 54 points, while St. Paul was second, scoring 44.

Deena Hams placed third in the javelin with a throw of 134'5". Hams broke her own school record of 122'8" she set last year.

Handy McCabe competed in four events at the state meet. He made the finals in the long jump with a personal best of 21'0 1/4", placing seventh. In the pole vault he tied his personal best of 12 feet, placing ninth. He triple jumped 41'5", failing to make the finals and tossed the discus 127'3", also failing to make the finals.

Shot putter Donnie Doherty did not make the finals of the shot put, throwing 46' for ninth.

Five boys meet records were set and two girls meet records were set. Matt Owen of Dayton set a new meet record with a leap of 6'8" in the high jump. Greg Vannice of Pine Eagle triple jumped 44'9", setting a new meet record in an event where three people were over the old record. In the preliminaries of the 200 meter dash, Enterprise's Shane Campbell sprinted to a new meet record of 22:07. Mike Wisnovsky of St. Mary's ran the 400 meter dash in a time of 48.65, bettering his own meet record. St. Mary's 1,600 meter relay team set a new meet record of 3:25.97. For the girls, Paula Berry
